For transfer to the School of Business and Economics of the University of Minnesota Duluth, the student should complete the liberal education requirement for UMD and prerequisite courses and supporting courses for the degree or major planned. Degrees available are: bachelor of accounting and bachelor of business administration with majors in finance, management, management information systems, and marketing. The management major offers options in human resources management and organizational management. Also, a major in economics is offered for the Bachelor of Arts degree (through the College of Liberal Arts). (Students must follow the degree requirements for the B.A. degree which requires declaring a minor or double major.)

High school preparation requirements apply to all students who graduated from high school after 1986 and plan to transfer to any college or branch of the University of Minnesota. If these requirements were not met by the student's high school coursework (grades 9-12), the must be met by the college coursework before admission to the University. See separate "High School Preparation" transfer guide if you graduated from High School after 1986

1. TRANSFER WITH AN ASSOCIATE IN ARTS (A.A.) DEGREE OR THE MINNESOTA TRANSFER CURRICULUM:

Students who have earned the A.A. degree from Anoka-Ramsey or who have completed the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum will be considered to have met the UMD's liberal education requirements.

2. TRANSFER WITHOUT AN A.A. OR THE MINNESOTA TRANSFER CURRICULUM:

Transfer without an A.A. degree or the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum must meet UMD's liberal education requirements. Refer to the TRANSFER TO THE UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA DULUTH general guide and the UMD catalog for information as to how your credits apply toward liberal education requirements.

3. PREREQUISITE AND SUPPORTING COURSES FOR ACCOUNTING AND BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION DEGREE:

Business 112, 1125, 2126 and 2215 Economics 2205 and 2206 Math 1300 and 1310 or 1400 Psychology 1110 Speech 2215 or 2220 or foreign language courses (contact UMD representative if interested in taking foreign languages)

Additionally, at least one course from the international perspective requirement and one course from the cultural diversity perspective must be taken within the liberal education requirements. (see the UMD General Transfer Guide.)

No more than 60 of the 120 credits for a bachelor's degree in accounting or business administration may be in accounting, business, or economics courses. Students should be advised that there is little room for non-liberal education courses. Contact the UMD admissions representative for further information.

PREREQUISITE AND SUPPORTING COURSE FOR ECONOMICS MAJOR:

Math 1300 and 1310 Economics 2205 and 2206 Note: UMD requires one accounting course (ACCT 2005). ARCC does not have an equivalent course; however, BUS 1125 and 2126 may be substituted to replace this course.

If at the time you transfer, your courses are not accepted according to the information on this guide, contact the person/office at your transfer institution listed on the top right hand corner of page one on this guide. If satisfactory resolution does not occur, contact an ARCC counselor for assistance

NOTE: This information should be used with the catalog of the intended transfer college, not in place of it. Changes in requirements occur periodically, so check with both the transfer college and the Anoka-Ramsey Counseling Center at least once a year for updated information.
